GEAR UP FAST FACTS

GEAR UP is a federal grant program designed to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. GEAR UP provides six- or seven-year competitive matching grants to provide services at high-poverty middle and high schools. GEAR UP grantees serve an entire cohort of students beginning no later than the seventh grade and follow the cohort through high school. GEAR UP funds may also be used to provide college scholarships to low-income students.

Texas GEAR UP consists of state and partnership grants that provide services to students, schools, and families designed to increase college attendance and success. This is accomplished through outreach, rigorous coursework, mentoring, tutoring, college access, and collegefinancing education. All GEAR UP grants operate through partnerships with public and private entities in order to best coordinate and leverage the wealth of resources available to students within state and local communities.

Additionally, Texas GEAR UP spearheads initiatives to enhance college awareness and readiness statewide. This includes: free collegesuccess education resources for all secondary students in the state; professional development related to college success for GEAR UP and non-GEAR UP schools; information about best practices related to college access and success.

The Texas GEAR UP state grant convenes all Texas GEAR UP grants through conferences, trainings, and workgroups to build resources and professional skills that will help us to increase college-going rates across the state.







Dr. Guy Bailey Founding President of The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley

Dr. Guy Bailey was named Founding President of The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV) in May of 2014.

Prior to being named President of UTRGV, Dr. Bailey served as President of the University of Alabama and of Texas Tech University; Chancellor of the University of Missouri - Kansas City (UMKC); Provost and Executive Vice President at The University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA); Dean of Liberal Arts at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas; Chair of the English Department at Oklahoma State University and the University of Memphis; and as a faculty member at Texas A&M and Emory Universities.

During his time at Texas Tech, the university met the criteria established by the Texas State Legislature for participation in the National Research University Fund; enrollment grew by 3,905 students (14%); research expenditures grew by \$89.9 million (170%); and graduation rates increased by five percentage points.

During his tenure at UTSA, the university was named an emerging research university by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; 16 new doctoral programs were added; external funding for research more than doubled; enrollment grew by more than 40%; and graduate enrollment grew by almost 50%.

While Dr. Bailey was at UMKC, the university completed a \$200 million capital campaign and built or gained approval for \$175 million in new construction. From 2010 to 2012, Dr. Bailey served on the Board of Directors of the NCAA and on the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Big XII athletic conference. He has also served on the Board of Trustees of Midwest Research Institute since 2007.

Dr. Bailey continues to do research on language change and variation. His research with his late wife, Jan, has been featured in a front-page article in *The New York Times*, on National Public Radio, on CNN Headline News, on BBC Radio, in *Texas Monthly*, and in the *San Antonio Express-News*. Since 1984, Dr. Bailey has brought in over \$1 million in external funding for his research.





Dr. Juliet V. García Senior Advisor to the Chancellor for Community, National and Global Engagement, UT System

Dr. Juliet V. García is a national thought leader who has devoted her life's work to higher education, focused on sustaining the democracy of our nation by empowering first-generation college students. As Senior Advisor to the Chancellor for Community, National and Global Engagement, she is committed to developing creative ways to expand the impact The UT System can have in accelerating success for all Texans.

Among the many honors she has received for her work is recognition by *Fortune* magazine as one of the World's 50 Greatest Leaders, and the American Council on Education Lifetime Achievement Award. In 2009, *Time* magazine named her one of the Top 10 College Presidents in the U.S. Most recently, she was awarded the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute Chair's Medallion Award and the League of United Latin American Citizens National Leadership Award.

Named the first female Mexican-American president of a U.S. college or university in 1986, Dr. García's presidency spanned 28 years and is marked by her innovation in conceiving and implementing new higher education models in response to rapidly shifting demographics.

Dr. García was born in Brownsville, Texas, where her father and his family immigrated when fleeing the Mexican Revolution. On her mother's side, she is a fifth-generation Texan. She is a first-generation college graduate, earning two degrees from the University of Houston and a Ph.D. in communication from The University of Texas at Austin. She has been married to Oscar E. Garcia for 47 years. They have two grown children and five grandchildren.





Dr. Ricardo Romo President, The University of Texas at San Antonio

Ricardo Romo became the fifth president of The University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA) in 1999. Under his leadership, UTSA was designated an emerging Tier One university and a leader in access to excellence in teaching, research and outreach. During his tenure, UTSA enrollment has grown 68 percent, and numerous programs and facilities were added to enhance student life.

A San Antonio native, Dr. Romo graduated from Fox Tech High School and attended The University of Texas at Austin on a track scholarship. He was the first Texan to run the mile in less than four minutes, holding the record 41 years. He earned a B.S. in education (1967).

Dr. Romo has a master's from Loyola Marymount University (1970) and a Ph.D. from UCLA (1975), both in history. A nationally respected urban historian, he is the author of *East Los Angeles: History of a Barrio*, now in its ninth printing.

He has received many honors, such as the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) Chief Executive Leadership Award. For his work in education and public service, Dr. Romo earned the Wheaton College Otis Social Justice Award. He has held numerous appointments, including the U.S. White House Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanics and served as Chair for the Southwest Research Institute and Vice Chair for Air University.

Dr. Romo is married to Dr. Harriett Romo, director of the UTSA Mexico Center and Bank of America Child and Adolescent Policy Research Institute. Avid art collectors, more than 60 prints from their collection were displayed at the McNay Museum in an exhibit on the U.S. Latino experience.

A talented photographer, Dr. Romo's photographs from travels to Cuba, Mexico, Africa and small-town Texas have been included in many regional exhibits and one in China.






Michael King Special Projects and Outreach Specialist, Institute for Public School Initiatives, UT Austin

Academic Extracurriculars, Summer Away Programs, and Model United Nations: Holistically Preparing Students for College Success

In partnership with Best Delegate, a global Model United Nations (MUN) education enterprise, IDEA Public Schools has pioneered the creation of a MUN League for high school students across 14 campuses in order for students to improve their leadership, debate techniques, publicspeaking skills, global awareness, and confidence to increase their college readiness. In 2014, a small group of students from IDEA Mission participated in Best Delegate's MUN Institute summer program. They returned from the program with the lesson plans, presentations, and leadership skills to implement a high quality and sustainable MUN program at their school with virtually no long-term costs. Over the past three summers, more than 100 students and teachers received training from the MUN Institute at Georgetown, Harvard, Columbia, and Austin College. Learning MUN is FUN for students, and summer away programs give students the opportunity to experience a diverse college life, develop their college graduate identity, and convince Mom and Dad that going to school away



from home may be the best way for them to succeed! Attendees will learn how participants in the program are experiencing great success, including students like Rebecca, who is now a Harvard sophomore and an advisor to the IDEA MUN League. Attendees will also learn about school-specific strategies for success, along with ways to incorporate academic extracurriculars into middle schools and high schools.

The Future of Mentoring: How Online Mentors Increase Student Motivation, Parent Engagement, and Solve Your Tracking Challenges

Your students and parents are always on the go, so the best way to reach them is to go where they are ... on their cell phone. In this session, you will learn how Harlandale GEAR UP built an online mentoring program to give each kid and parent a mentor in their pocket that they can connect with after school. Harlandale GEAR UP has connected 550 students with an online mentor and 475 of their parents with an online parent coach. Every student and parent connects with their mentor or coach via their cell phone. The technology allows Harlandale to collect data from text messages and phone conversations to improve their school services and programming. One example is a three-day camp they put on that allowed students to meet their online

mentor in person after a year of texting and talking via phone.

The students in the program are graduating this year, so the platform will be the solution to track the students' first year in postsecondary education. Our presenters include a mix of our staff, partners, parents, and students, so the audience can see how our small district created innovative change through our GEAR UP grant.

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
